### Paving The Road Designing the present from the future

### THE JANUS MOVEMENT CREATING THE HISTORY OF THE FUTURE OF DESIGN THINKING

To quote the Chinese proverb, "we are living in interesting times", to put it mildly. In fact, we are currently middle of the seventh mass extinction. Unlike previous extinction events caused by natural phenomena, this is driven entirely by human activity. Our anthropocentric growth may have led to material wealth creation, but our unsustainable practices have left us vulnerable to the impact of climate change and environmental degradation. Interestingly, our ancestors not only faced similar complex challenges, but they also successfully solved them using ancient wisdom which has been tried and tested for thousands of years. We have reached a polycrisis point for people and planet and our current innovation through design thinking praxis is not fit for purpose. What if we chose to lean into and learn from ancient and indigenous design knowledges? Could we transform our approach to innovation, sustainability, and human-centred design. We think we can and are calling this a Janus approach – looking to the past and future in the same moment to solve complex problems. This playshop offers an opportunity to explore a Janus approach to innovation for sustainability, using harvested case studies of storied ancestral wisdom from Ireland and India.

In this polycrises of climate change, pandemics, geopolitical turbulence, economic instability (Tooze, 2023), we need to 'break free from design thinking as usual'. This playshop is perhaps a first tentative step on that journey.

Begin your journey at the Agora of Smyrna, an ancient archaeological site in the heart of the city. Then visit Kontak Learning Hub, where new approaches to education and creativity are prototyped. TARKEM shares its mission to restore and reactivate izmir's historical urban core through sustainable development. The tour concludes at the beautifully restored Portuguese Synagogue, now home to EGiAD's Cultural and Social Events Center.
